*From the Pastor's Desk*

## “A Man Named Martin”

Many of you know that this year is the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of when Martin Luther nailed the 95 Theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. To celebrate this anniversary and our Lutheran heritage, our church is going to be having a special service on Reformation Sunday. Please continue to look in the Triune for more information on this very special Sunday!

Leading up to this festive day, I'd like to invite you to a three-session Bible study on the Reformation entitled, “*A Man Named Martin: The Movement.*” Put out by Lutheran Hour Ministries, this video series takes a close look at the widespread teachings of the late Medieval Church that were superfluous to the Bible or not scripturally grounded. Among them were purgatory, penance, celibacy, prayers for the dead, and the one most often linked to the Reformation: the sale of indulgences. We'll look at how these errant teachings and wayward traditions eventually sparked the Protestant Reformation, a theological overhaul set in motion by what happened on October 31<sup>st</sup>, 1517 when Martin Luther nailed the 95 Theses on the church door at Wittenberg.

This Bible study series features a number of scholars, professional church workers, and pastors as they add insight and expertise to this fascinating period in the life of Martin Luther. After each video is played, we'll have the opportunity to go more in-depth as we go through a discussion guide. If you're wondering what the Reformation was all about or if you're curious to learn more about Martin Luther, I encourage you to invite a friend and join us as we learn more about Martin Luther and the Reformation together!



### Martin Luther's Sermons

Our congregation has received a wonderful donation from Erik Gustafson (son of Helene and Gary) in memory of Pastor John Collier. This eight volume set of Martin Luther's sermons will be in our church library, available for all our members to read.

It is interesting to note the reason for Luther writing these sermons. The introduction in volume one explains that in Luther's time, most of the preachers were incapable of writing their own sermons. Typically they read the Gospel and Epistle lessons, and then read a sermon that another preacher had written. Luther wrote sermons and then made them available to these preachers. He did this primarily to prevent the work of fanatics and sects to be spread.

The sermons in volumes one through five are based on the Gospel texts beginning with the first Sunday in Advent. Volumes six to eight focus on the Epistle lessons beginning with Advent and Christmas.

Scan through this wonderful donation, borrowing and returning them as you would any library book. These were meant for all of us to study and enjoy!





# A Stewardship Moment

## Thinking



Study the number pattern. Fill in the missing numbers

Recently a math puzzle has circled the internet that seems to be impossible to solve. Further investigation reveals that there is indeed a solution but that solution is certainly not intuitive and even during the explanation two answers are generated, you must know which answer is the correct one (that is the one the poser wants you to achieve). Two other examples of difficult if not impossible to solve puzzles also have turned up that torment your mind, leaving you wondering what to think. Thinking is the key word here and even though each of these puzzles come with a description of how to solve the problem, there is an implicit assumption that you know the process to produce the result that the poser of the problem believes to be the correct answer. Believing is the second key word, and the solutions provided are so circuitous that one might doubt that the result is rational, while one of the three problems has a “socially acceptable” answer, it seems that time has changed the process such that there would be two results depending on whether you use the old or new procedure.

Puzzles like these are certainly a challenge and force you to “Think Outside the Box”. However, being outside your comfort zone will make you confused and even embarrassed when you are in a social environment, which could make you want to change your thinking to avoid that annoyance. Modifying your thinking could go more than one way though and this is where our reliance on God becomes important.

In Matthew 11:28-31 Jesus said, “Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light.” We love to repeat this and it is very comforting but for the Religious leaders of Jesus’s day what He just said was “Blasphemy”. These leaders plus many of the Jewish population had “Memorized” their Bible (The Tanakh), not like we memorize verses but such that if you put three words together they would be able to tell you where it was in the “Tanakh”. So it was, when Jesus spoke those “Words of Comfort”, He was actually doing a “Bible Study”.

Jesus said He would give rest to the “heavy laden”, but in Exodus 33:14 God told Moses that His presence would give him rest. Was Jesus saying that He was God by offering rest? I’m sure that those religious leaders were thinking so. When He was talking about “A Yoke”, those people may have been thinking of Rehoboam (1Kings 12:14) and the yoke that he had placed on the Israelites after the death of Soloman and how there was no rest but Jesus said that His yoke came with a cost. Jeremiah 6:16 said, “Stand in the ways and see, And ask for the old paths, where the good way is, And walk in it; Then you will find rest for your souls. But they said, ‘We will not walk in it.’”. Jesus went on to talk about His humility and gentleness, for those Israelites it brought to mind Numbers 12:3, how humble Moses was, how God said that Moses was the only man God spoke to “Face to Face” and more than that in Deuteronomy 18:15 God promises to raise up a prophet like Moses that the Israelites should listen to. Certainly, there were those who made that connection and felt threatened by the thought that Jesus was the only “Man” who could talk to God “Face to Face” and since He had already alluded to being God, He must believe himself to be better than Moses. All of that in just one small statement must have left the Pharisees with job insecurity and just as we see our world turned around with atheism and their domination of our culture so they were chaotic with Jesus’s domination of their culture.

Another of Jesus’s appearances resulted in a “Bible Study” yet without the Biblical knowledge that the Pharisees had this meeting would not have registered. In John 8:2-11 Jesus encounters the Pharisees and a woman caught in adultery. What this amounts to is that some teachers of the law would have advocated the stoning that the law prescribes but other teachers advocated “Love Your Neighbor” took precedence, thus Jesus was now to be the final judge of the woman’s fate. What was Jesus’s response, He started to scratch in the dirt. What is that all about? The Jews around Him immediately turn the pages to Jeremiah 17:13, “Lord, you are the hope of Israel; all who forsake you will be put to shame. Those who turn away from you will be written in the dust because they have forsaken the Lord, the spring of living water.” That simple act put those religious leaders in judgement and turned the tables on what they expected would be a trial of the woman. In that same act, He declared Himself as the “Hope of Israel and The Spring of Living Water. What about that. That’s not all folks, those teachers also knew that Jeremiah 17:10 said, “I the Lord search the heart and examine the mind, to reward each person according to their conduct, according to what their deeds deserve.” When Jesus questioned the quality of their deeds, they knew that they were exposed and should exit and avoid further loss. Jeremiah even provides an affirmation for the woman when in 17:18 it says, “Let my persecutors be put to shame, but keep me from shame; let them be terrified, but keep me from terror. Bring on them the day of disaster; destroy them with double destruction.” Jesus wasn’t soft on adultery, since His last words were, “Go now and leave your life of sin” but the message is, Grace takes precedence over Sin.

As New Testament Christians, we often miss a large part of the Gospel Message when we neglect the message of the Old Testament. After all the Disciples and Paul had to proclaim the message of Jesus’s redemptive power using only that Old Testament that we often ignore.
