## “The Solar Eclipse”

As I am writing this, many people are looking forward to the solar eclipse. On Monday, August 21<sup>st</sup>, there will be a rare complete solar eclipse across North America. The total eclipse path will start in Oregon and end in South Carolina. Here in Upstate New York, we should be able to see a partial solar eclipse. What will happen is that the moon will pass between the sun and the earth and block all or part of the sun for up to **three hours**. For this particular eclipse, the longest period when the moon will completely block the sun from any given location will be about 2 minutes and 40 seconds. That means it'll seem like nighttime around 2pm! **This solar eclipse is truly a remarkable event.** Because of the moon's orbit angle, a solar eclipse is something that doesn't happen very often. The last time the contiguous U.S. saw a total eclipse was in 1979, some 38 years ago (I've been around on this earth for 34 years and some change, and I'm totally looking forward in seeing my first solar eclipse!)

As awesome as this solar eclipse will be, looking directly at the sun during a solar eclipse can burn or damage your eyes. It's unsafe to look directly at the sun except during the brief moment when the moon entirely blocks the sun's bright face. The only safe way to look directly at the partially eclipsed sun is by wearing special-purpose solar filters called “eclipse glasses.” Ordinary sunglasses, even the very dark ones, aren't safe for looking at the sun; they transmit thousands of times too much sunlight. It's important to always use a safe solar filter to view the sun.

This reminds me of a story in the book of Exodus. In Exodus 33, Moses is meeting with the Lord and he asks God to “*please show me your glory.*” (vs. 18) And God tells Moses, “*I will make all my goodness pass before you and will proclaim before you my name ‘The LORD.’ And I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will show mercy on whom I will show mercy. But you cannot see my face, for man shall not see me and live. Behold, there is a place by me where you shall stand on the rock, and while my glory passes by I will put you in a cleft of the rock, and I will cover you with my hand until I have passed by. Then I will take away my hand, and you shall see my back, but my face shall not be seen.*” (vs. 19-23)

Moses asks to see God's glory, but God tells him that He would reveal His goodness. When God's Presence passes by, Moses will only be able to see just a glimpse. The reason is because Moses, and all humanity, is born with and infected by sin. A sinful human would not be able to withstand the full

revelation of God's presence and glory without being destroyed. But the world would be able to see God.

In John 1, we read that “*the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.*” This verse simply tells us that God became man. Men and women were able to see God when Christ Jesus put on flesh, came to this earth and lived among us. The Bible tells us that people were excited about Jesus in the things that he said and did. God's glory was certainly manifested in Jesus throughout his ministry on earth, but even more so when Jesus humbly went to the cross. Once adored and considered a king, Jesus would be despised as a criminal. Shouts of “Hosanna!” turned to shouts of “Crucify him!” In going to the cross for our sins, Jesus' death shows God's grace and mercy to us.

Jesus was crucified on a Friday. For six hours, he suffers on the cross. Mark 15 tells us “*when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice... ‘My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?’...And Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed his last.*” (Mark 15:33-35, 37)

For six hours Jesus is on the cross. For the last **three of those hours** (from noon-3pm) darkness was over the whole land. Heavy darkness comes over the world. This darkness is a sign of judgment over sin, and the sorrow God the Father has over His Son's death. But the darkness would lift and the Light of the world would soon be revealed. The Son would be raised!

By the time you read this, the solar eclipse will have come and gone. (If you missed it, there will be another one coming down the pike soon—the next solar eclipse visible from North America will be April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024.) A solar eclipse is amazing, but the **resurrection of Jesus is truly the most remarkable event ever!** It's something we may not have seen with our own eyes but it's something we believe by faith. Through the eyes of faith, we can behold the glory of God as we celebrate our risen Savior and the victory we have in him. Right now Jesus sits exalted at God's right hand but very soon, we'll all behold him when he comes back to earth one final time to take us home to heaven.

What a sight that will be! I can't wait to see this! How about you?

## Food Shelf News Summer 2017



Our Food Shelf Board met in July for a short meeting. It was reported that through the generosity of the participating churches and community, we are in good shape both financially and with food supplies. The need is sporadic, some weeks we have one call and other weeks there are six calls. We have been able to supply food and general household items to 82 families during a three month period (March 28<sup>th</sup> to July 11<sup>th</sup>). The families we served have expressed their gratitude.

Churches in Spencerport continue to coordinate food drives. We also have food collection bins in many retail areas in our community. The local Scouts, Post Office, and Library have had food drives recently.

The food shelf site coordinator lets us know when a need becomes apparent. We will let our congregation know of that need in two ways. A notice will be placed on the board next to the secretary's office and also in the Sunday bulletin. With your help, SEFS will not need to spend money on food but can use it for rent and grocery gift cards for our clients.

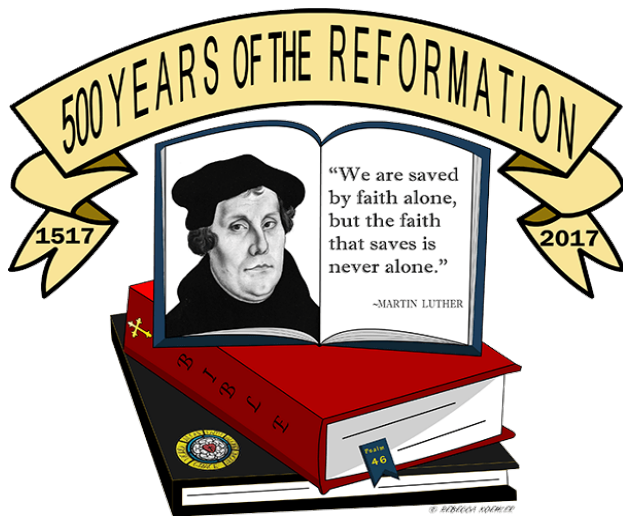

# A Stewardship Moment

## *Splagna*

When you get out of bed in the morning do you say to yourself, "I hope that I meet someone who tells me I am wrong"? A miniscule number of people will raise their hand on that one, but if you ask, "Who wants to be loved?" there will be few who won't answer positively to that one.

Jesus said, *"If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."* (John 8:31-32). So how do you teach people Jesus' truths when the people literally refuse to go to church? Jesus went out to the people where they were, healed them and taught them. He went to places where "Good Jews" don't go and befriended sinful people and His response was, *"It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."* (Mark 2:17). Christians today have three major evangelical handicaps, first of all they blend into the secular world we all inhabit so well that this "Salt & Light" thingy doesn't really stick out as much as it should, secondly they come packed with a bunch of "Rules" along with the "Good News of Jesus" which most unchurched today are not interested in and finally many of them are much too righteous to attract those sinful people Jesus was speaking of.

So how do you bring those sinful people who most desperately need the "Grace of God" to Jesus so that they can receive this Grace? Well Vince Antonucci has a plan, initially he has opened a church in Las Vegas called Verve (Church for the Rest of Us) and it is right on "The Strip", his plan is to do just as Jesus did and go to the "Sinful & Cynical" people of this world. If you can look these "Heavily Pierced" and "Multiply Tattooed" people in the eye and love them at then you know how Vince felt and why he started Verve Church. Wait there is more, his success has inspired him to begin an effort he calls **Splagna** (you can read about it at <http://tulip.newsprouting.com/verve/?view=mobile>) that aspires to plant churches in some of the most sinful places in America and even beyond. Folks this is where the mission field really is!

Perhaps you're not ready to enter this mission field but that won't exclude you from any of the other mission fields but if you are to be a missionary where ever you go you must be a follower of Jesus. Bono said that he had been asking God to bless what he was doing until someone told him to turn his life around and "Get involved in what God is doing because it's already blessed". This is good advice for all of us but frequently when you do that your life will get out of control. Following Jesus is an adventure but could result in 'Being

in a boat in a raging storm ([Mark 4:35-41](#)) or Dealing with a crazy man ([Mark 5:1-20](#)) or Worst of all losing your life ([Acts 7:54-60](#)). So it is those who follow Jesus will be "Astonished and Afraid" ([Mark 10:32](#)) and perhaps if you aren't "Astonished and Afraid" maybe you aren't really following Jesus since He will likely lead you into places where you may be uncomfortable and wouldn't normally go, give you assignments that you feel incapable of accomplishing and ask you to trust Him at a time in your life when that seems impossible.

In the first century the church was dedicated to taking care of the widows and orphans of that time because they were the most vulnerable. The Apostles went so far as to designate some individuals for that purpose ([Acts 6:1-7](#)). Today that ministry still exists and one effort is called [Both Hands](#), and if you go to their website and click on the "Resources" link you will learn a great deal about what you can do to support this effort and even to become involved.

These are two distinctly different opportunities for ministry, one offers Jesus to people who are searching for clarity in their lives and the other addresses those who need restoration either of property or life or both. In whichever direction you chose to go it is important that you demonstrate two major attributes, that of "Compassion" and "Love". These characteristics are not easily manifested and it is often necessary to enlist the help of the "Holy Spirit" in order to accomplish that goal. People over estimate their nature and come off appearing very different from what they set out to be. So it is, "Prayer" becomes a key component in every ministry effort. We all regularly pray for God's will to be done here on Earth just as it is in heaven but what is God's will for the Earth? ([1 Timothy 2:1-7](#)) gives some insight as to what that is and while reading on could distress some the "Kernel" of instruction is in these sentences. Prayer should always be that of thanksgiving and not of complaint or criticism. The outcome of that sort of prayer is that you live in a peace filled environment with safe streets and safe Godly cities. Does anyone take prayer that seriously, I suspect the answer is no. God provides us with copious amounts of time to pray. At least 5 days a week millions of people spend as much as an hour driving to work. What do they do while in transit? Couldn't that time be spent in prayer? Each time you are distracted with whatever is a prayer opportunity and the more you pray with "Love" and "Compassion" the more God's power is released into the world and His will better done.

By all means do ministry but in the midst of that activity remember to release God's Power into your effort through "Constant Prayer". Without prayer it's all about you but with prayer it's all about God working through you.
